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Debbie's Dream Foundation: Curing Stomach Cancer Hosted Its 7th Annual Stomach Cancer Capitol Hill Advocacy Day

Advocates gathered on Capitol Hill to urge Congress to increase research resources in the fight against stomach cancer.

Washington, D.C. – (February 28, 2019) – Debbie's Dream Foundation: Curing Stomach Cancer (DDF) held its 7th Annual Stomach Cancer Capitol Hill Advocacy Day in Washington D.C. on February 25-26, 2019. The event allows advocates to meet with congressional lawmakers to share their personal stories and relay the latest statistics and facts about stomach cancer. Each year, advocates ask that stomach cancer remain eligible for funding through the Department of Defense's Peer Reviewed Cancer Research Program. Funding increases for the National Cancer Institute and investment in stomach cancer research is also a top priority.

DDF presented Congresswoman Anna Eshoo, of California's 18th Congressional District, with the Congressional Champion Award in recognition of her commitment to reducing death and suffering from stomach cancer and other recalcitrant cancers that have a five-year survival rate of less than 50 percent and through the launch and continued leadership of the Deadliest Cancers Caucus.

"It is always an honor to be granted the opportunity to meet with lawmakers who are genuinely interested and committed to funding stomach cancer research," said DDF Executive Director Andrea Eidelman. "We've been fortunate to have had past support from congressional leaders such as U.S. Representative Lois Frankel and former Representative Ileana Ros-Lehtinen. This year, we are looking forward to building new relationships and strengthening others to ensure our mission gets included in the conversation."

DDF was honored to have the support of fellow stomach cancer organization No Stomach For Cancer as a Platinum Sponsor. This support allowed DDF to provide scholarships to patients and caregivers that allowed them to travel to Washington, D.C., to participate in this year's Advocacy Day.

Also, DDF's California Monterey Chapter Co-Founder Branny Carrasco was presented the 2019 Volunteer of the Year Award for her incredible devotion to the fight against stomach cancer.
